- The Children's Aid Society (CAS) was founded in 1853 in New York City as an anti-poverty organization
- \$110M annual budget ; ~ 2,000 full-time and part-time staff
- Services reach 70,000 children and families annually
- Citywide we offer more than 100 programs in 45 locations clustered in FOUR high-needs neighborhoods
 - South Bronx
 - East and Central Harlem
 - Washington Heights
 - Northern Staten Island



- In 2011 we launched our strategic plan <u>Keeping the</u> <u>Promise</u>
- GOAL: Organizational wide strategy to help children that come through our doors to graduate college
- Keeping the Promise is focused on outcomes in 4 domains:
 - 1. health
 - 2. education
 - 3. social and emotional development
 - 4. family stability

- We provide comprehensive supports from cradle through college to children and their families:
 - Early childhood programs
 - After-school, weekend and summer enrichment programs
 - Foster care and preventive services
 - Comprehensive medical services (including medical, mental health and dental)
- **Children's Aid is organized into 5 programmatic areas:**
 - Early Childhood
 - School Age
 - Adolescence
 - Child Welfare and Family Services
 - Health and Wellness

Connecting Families to Services

- Office of Client Advocacy
 - Founded in 1997
 - Provides advocacy on legal issues
 - Access to public benefits
 - Access to the New York Times Neediest Cases Fund


Since inception more than 21,000 families have been helped

- Health Care Access Program (HCAP)
 - Started in 1998
 - Facilitated enrollment program based in schools, community centers, health clinics, etc.

Since 2008 more than 42,000 individuals have been enrolled


