
NATIONAL APPROACH TO CHILD POVERTY

CONSENSUS STUDY REPORT

A Roadmap to Reducing Child Poverty

Results of the 2019 NASEM Study

- Tackling child poverty was seen as achievable
- Change in the way we measure the number of children living in poverty
- Expanding and improving the CTC would cut child poverty in half over a decade
- Identified an \$800 billion to \$1.1 trillion annual cost of child poverty to society
- Found no evidence that providing supports like the CTC reduces work



NEXT STEPS



Next Steps

- Continue to elevate importance of CTC, CDCTC, &EITC
- Educate legislators, staff, & administration on efficacy & varying roles of tax credit policies
- Advocate for permanent authorization of tax credit reforms authorized in the American Rescue Plan Act

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
